In 1223, about fifteen days before Christmas, Francis sent for his friend, John Velito from Greccio, and he said to him: "... I want to do something that will recall the memory of that child who was born in Bethlehem, to see with bodily eyes the inconveniences of his infancy, how he lay in the manger, and how the ox and ass stood by." *1Cel 84-87*

Francis loved Christmas more than any other time. For him, it was the ultimate reminder of how much God loved us, to come to us, to become one of us and show us the way to be truly human. The Incarnation is the true compassion of God that Francis perceived so clearly. He was so filled with joy that he invited everyone else to discover the eternal mystery and, with him, to enter into it in a stark way.
